XENIA, OH—Greene County Public Health's Tobacco Prevention and Cessation program is working with Teens Against Tobacco (TAT), part of Greene County Family and Children First's Youth Move group, and other local agencies to hold a **Color Walk and Health Fair in Xenia on Saturday, April 5, 2025**, to raise awareness about the dangers and accessibility of tobacco products to youth.

Teens Against Tobacco is a group of middle and high school students from Greene County Family & Children First's Youth Move group committed to youth tobacco prevention. The other agencies supporting this event are the Xenia YMCA, the Ohio Department of Health Tobacco Use Prevention and Cessation Program, and the Central State University Extension Office. The Color Walk and Health Fair will be held on Saturday, April 5, 2025, from 10:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. at the Xenia YMCA at 336 S. Progress Drive in Xenia. The health fair will feature local resources and organizations.
