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Local Agencies Announce Events Planned for Overdose Awareness Month

XENIA, OH – Greene County Public Health officials have announced a collaboration with the Hope Spot, Freedom Recovery Ministries, and AHOP Church for several events from Saturday, August 24 through Saturday, August 31 in Xenia in honor and recognition of Overdose Awareness Month and International Overdose Awareness Day.

International Overdose Awareness Day is the world's largest annual campaign to end overdose, remember without stigma those who have died from overdose, and acknowledge the grief of the family and friends left behind. This year's theme for 2024 is "Together We Can", highlighting the power of our community when we all stand together. We honor the people whose lives have been altered by overdose, whether they are family and friends grieving the loss of a loved one; workers in healthcare and support services extending strength and compassion; or spontaneous first responders who selflessly assume the role of lifesaver.

In 2023, Greene County Public Health distributed almost 3,300 Naloxone rescue kits to prevent opioid overdoses. Since January 2023, these kits have saved 203 people from dying from an opioid overdose. Saving someone's life with Naloxone (Narcan®) provides a chance for that person to seek recovery.

Greene County Public Health, Hope Spot, Freedom Recovery Ministries, and AHOP invite community members to join in the following events:

Individuals who have lost someone to overdose are invited to participate in memorial rock painting activities. This provides a creative and therapeutic space for remembrance and healing, allowing participants to honor their loved ones in a meaningful way. Activities will include:

- Painting rocks as a tribute to those lost to overdose
- An opportunity to share stories and connect with others who have experienced similar losses
- A supportive environment for reflection and community bonding

This event is open to the public, and we encourage everyone to join us in this heartfelt activity. Together, we can create a lasting tribute to those we've lost while fostering a sense of community and support for one another.

Hope Spot, in collaboration with Freedom Recovery Ministries, will be holding a Candlelight Vigil. This special evening is dedicated to remembering those we've lost to overdose, supporting those who continue to struggle, and raising awareness about the impact of overdose in our community.

The evening will include:

- A gathering for food, worship, and reflection
- Sharing stories of those affected by overdose
- An opportunity to come together as a community to spread love, support, and awareness

This event is open to the public, and we encourage everyone to attend and show their support. The vigil will provide a space for healing and remembrance, where we can stand together in solidarity against the stigma surrounding addiction and overdose.

• Friday, August 30, all day, everywhere – Wear Purple!

We invite everyone to wear purple in support of Overdose Awareness. This simple act of solidarity helps raise awareness about the impact of overdose in our community and honors those we have lost to this tragic epidemic.
